- 1. How should the club conduct tournaments in 2026?
 - a) No tournaments-0 Responses
 - b) Fewer tournaments-Specify number and type-O Responses
 - c) Tournaments with less than two week duration-24 Responses
 - -2 Day Tournament
 - -Tournaments 2.0, 3.0, 4.0 Extended over 2 weeks
 - -Less time-how about round robin?
 - d) Continue the same-Specify how to increase participants-12 Responses
 - -8 or 10 game pro sets?
 - -Label it a non-tourney
 - -Bring back 135
 - -Not sure. Find out why people do not participate. Try to meet any objections. For the men's tourney, if we have another year with low participation, then cancel.
 - -Pickleball/Tennis
 - -No age limit, blind draw
 - -Maybe no-ad scoring to shorten some daily matches
 - -Use 2 sets with third set tie breaker
 - -Try to get the point across that tournaments are for charity and not necessarily for winning. I know that some are very competitive and only want good partners. Our challenge is to sell the good that our contributions do for the needy. Somehow it must be stressed that you are playing for charity not plaques.

- -Shorter matches, pro-set or no deuce games

- -December tourn.-2 in spring-spread out the play. Pro sets to reduce the time on court
- -More round robin
- -Skill based tournaments. Play over a number of weeks, one match per week. Make elimination equal (it is not fair as now structured)

 - -Highlight/announce any clinics by Glenn/Karen

 - -Another strap for tennis nets

- -Learn to use our website-what a great resource! Can we give help to anyone who asks "how do I get into it"? Emails with a link to website is always good. Use TWISCOV. Build relationships with U of A etc programs
- -Have a box in the tennis room where we can share used equipment
- -Invite more Pickleball players. Train new people how to play.
- -Better court upkeep, storage room organization, develop more interclub play, membership recruitment
- -I love it!
- -List current month activities in the Tipster and TWISCOV. Photo club does this.
- -Website needs to be better organized, difficult to find tournaments, events and play tennis. E Blasts when necessary.
- -I like Martha's idea to put insert in Tipster that lists the upcoming events. Are we allowed to hire outside coaches from raquet clubs or schools for level-specific/skills specific drills-paid for by participant drill fee? Not to take anything away from Gelenn and Karin, but to have additional learning opportunities would be awesome.
- -Tell our sponsors about the perks-how we advertise for them. Also tell them that we use the \$ for charity. We must be up to \$40,000+ for charity so far. My sponsor liked that!
- -Occasional flyer in Tipster. T-Th-Sa players should contribute \$1.00 toward person providing balls. Many members also play Pickleball and/or pop tennis. Greater involvement and savings could be achieved with joint events.
- -Put upcoming events in Tipster. Also use weekly SCOV news for upcoming events.
- -Pleased with the new scorecards-look great. Trash cans? Are they broken? Clean?
- -User friendly website-which hopefully will come about. Use of emails at specific times. More visibility of tennis board to keep members updated on their responsibilities and roles. Getting more sponsors.
- -New homeowners as well as renters should be made aware of the tennis club beyond reading/skimming the Tipster. I don't know what is allowed as far as communication.
- -Convince administration to hire a professional to manage audio/visual system for performances (ie Mariachi Concert) in auditorium.
- -Get word out to community just how much money our tournaments raise and the good it does. I am pretty sure most people have no idea how generous our tennis club has been and continues to be!
- -Extra strap for nets, zip ties to tie nets down tight to the poles.
